Parenting Assessment and Skill Development Service (PASDS)

- Working with families with a child under two.
- Intensive service delivery 4-6 hours per week.
- In home assessment and skill development.
- 4-week assessment period followed by assessment report.
- 6-week skill development on identified goals.
- Outcomes measured by North Carolina Family Assessment Scale (NCFAS)
